Inclement Weather

"Neither rain, nor snow, nor sleet, nor hail shall keep the postal workers from their appointed rounds."

We have all heard these words attributed to postal workers but this week, we proved the same is true for us as well! The level of commitment to our students shown this week, despite the lack of heat, floods, leaks, lack of space to teach in a dry location, and all the other calls that came in, is well beyond the high expectations we hold for ourselves. We fought through the weather conditions when we knew that the district had not prepared beforehand for the storm.

For those of us who could not come to work despite best efforts and intentions due to fallen trees or unsafe driving conditions, we will take the use of the sick days to HR to see if we can get them realigned as district days - no guarantee, but we spoke to the district on Monday to say that we would think nature's wrath resulting in a blockade from safely getting to work should not be on our shoulders and taken from our sick days. We also heard late Wednesday that some site administration let folks go home early on Wednesday after the student instructional day (a shortened day of the week for elementary sites). If that occurred, we spoke to HR to make sure that folks would not be disciplined if they left early that day.

Going forward, please let HEA if you used a sick day because you could not make it in to work blocked or flooded roads, etc. **or** if you receive a request for a meeting for attendance and/or receive discipline for leaving early **or** if you had to move to another room during the week because of leaks, flooding, etc.

Special Education News

We have heard from many of you regarding the needs of our students and teachers not being met due to a lack of responses (meaningful or not) from the district. We have requested meetings with the SpEd leadership and with HR to discuss concerns and issues as well as to share our expectations and next steps, including grievances, etc.

Universal Screener

We received notice that TK-1 has a training coming up related to the Universal Screener. The concern is three-fold:

- 1. That the training/meeting is being held within the instructional day resulting in people missing preps and collaboration time and/or
- 2. The meeting/training is held after the school day without a mention of compensation and
- 3. No mention of make up if someone cannot attend.

We have put in the phone calls to the district to remedy this and hope to have everything settled by the end of today.

SBDM Stipends

The new folks at the district are working on the stipend paperwork that the sites have submitted. Please make sure that both co-chairs receive this paperwork to review. Errors are being made on the amounts that are being paid out - *not in our favor!* Please let us know if you have any questions or notice discrepancies. We will also bring this to the attention of the SBDM Central Team at Tuesday's meeting.



Memorandums of Understanding (MOU)/Side Letters of Agreement (SLA)

We continue to develop MOUs and SLAs with the district in response to programs, grants, etc. that the district is implementing. Currently, we are working on: Sown to Grow (a mental health response program), the modernization and refresh of sites, the full-day preschool program, Intramural Programs at comprehensive High Schools, **Ethnic Studies**, SLP overages/extra duty, and Community Schools - to name a few. Through the negotiations involved within these MOUS/SLAs, we advocate for the best working conditions possible and upholding our rights - e.g., hours, pay, timelines, etc. We are working to secure language as quickly as possible and hope that the district will honor our requested timeline of finalizing language of most of these topics by next week.

Bargaining

The Bargaining team is moving forward with creating proposals and will work with the district to secure dates to begin contract negotiations.
