<u>Community Schools Update – Cease and Desist</u>

We want to be sure that you all know that there is a cease and desist in place for any work involving Community Schools until such time that we can get an MOU in place and get much needed clarity. After giving the district dates to negotiate an MOU as quickly as possible, they have responded and we have scheduled a meeting with the district to do this the week we return from Thanksgiving Break. So please share with your teams and co-chairs that this cease and desist is in place and there should not be any meetings or work related to Community Schools until we get an MOU.

ABAR Make-up Training

We have heard from the district that the ABAR make-up training was optional and as such would not be compensated. See the District's response below:

"The make-up sessions are optional and voluntary to attend.

The unit members who are paid to attend the make-up sessions are as follows:

- Preschool teachers who attended option 2 outside of their working hours
- Adult School teachers who were teaching at the time of the October 24 professional learning session
- The preschool and adult school teachers will be paid based on sign in via stipend sheet, no timecard is required

There is no additional compensation for attending the sessions."

We do NOT recall negotiating this agreement and will address this upon our return.



Bargaining Update

The Bargaining Team met on Wednesday, November 15th for the long-awaited bargaining session this year. HEA presented an Article 12 Class Size counter proposal including proposals related to our Sp Ed caseloads and related to improving our abilities to meet our students' academic and emotional needs. We also presented proposals related to Article 11 Leaves which included, among other things, increasing the abilities for leaves with pay. We had expected, given the time between our sessions (we had last met in summer), that the district would come prepared with the counter proposal to our Article 9 Safety proposal... They did not. No real explanation was given except that they did not realize that they even had the proposal!?... They did! We will meet again on December 1st. We will let folks know of our progress.
