

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Over this long weekend for MLK Jr. Day, take a moment to reflect on the strides led by Martin Luther King made to address injustice. As we reflect on our history of struggle and progress in light of today's climate, we face a clear obligation to continue our fight for a just and equal society. Unions have a proud history of fighting for both economic and social justice, and we remember today the words MLK Jr. wrote in "All Labor Has Dignity":

"The labor movement was the principal force that transformed misery and despair into hope and progress. Out of its bold struggles, economic and social reform gave birth to unemployment insurance, old age pensions, government relief for the destitute, and, above all, new wage levels that meant not mere survival but a tolerable life."

#### Mandated Reporting (Public Works) Training

We encourage everyone to fill out the <u>LCAP Survey</u> keeping this truism in mind to include improvements such as smaller class sizes, more SEL counselors, more Sp Ed resources, competitive salaries that attract and retain HEA members, and any other ideas to improve teaching and learning in Hayward. Hayward students and HEA educators deserve no less! The survey deadline is February 16<sup>th</sup>.
